ENA Annual Meeting Minutes

February 16, 2023, 6:30-8:30 pm

The ENA Annual Meeting was held online via Zoom. ENA Secretary, Sandie Koplowitz presided over the meeting. There were 76 participants. No attendance was taken, but attendance was documented by screenshots taken during the meeting (included at the end of these minutes). There were three presentations, followed by the ENA Annual Meeting.

Presentations:

1. How will the proposed citywide Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU) and statewide single-family zoning regulations impact Edgemoor residents?

Larry Horowitz, ENA Land Use Chair, provided an overview of current ADU zoning and regulation activities city-wide and state-wide. The slides he presented can be viewed at PowerPoint-ADU-Single-Family-Zoning.pdf.

3. Update on the Jones subdivision, aka The Woods at Viewcrest

Larry Horowitz presented slides of property images and documents relating to the Jones Development on Viewcrest Road aka The Woods at Viewcrest. Discussion followed with concerns raised about the steep cliffs below the development, potential adverse effects on the forest, water quality of the bay and wildlife. Once city staff determines the applications are sufficiently complete to begin their review, the city will issue a *Notice of Application*. The Notice triggers a minimum 30-day public comment period.

After the minimum comment period, the city's SEPA official is free to issue the city's SEPA threshold determination. A *Determination of Significance* (DS) triggers the requirement for an environmental impact statement (EIS). An EIS requirement is not triggered for a *Determination of Non-Significance* (DNS) or a *Mitigated Determination of Non-Significance* (MDNS). After the city issues its SEPA threshold determination, there will be another public comment period to challenge the determination.

When city staff complete their review of the application materials and consideration of public comment, staff will forward their recommendation to the city's Hearing Examiner. The Hearing Examiner will hold a public hearing prior to making a decision on the application.

- The minutes from the ENA Annual Meeting on March 23, 2022 were approved.
- Treasurer's Report Bob McCarthy reported there is currently \$1,580 in the checking account with annual expenses of \$150/year for website fees and \$20/year for corporation renewal. The City of Bellingham reimburses neighborhood associations for up to \$500 per year for operating expenses.
- MNAC Report Bill Beer Bill gave a brief Mayor's Neighborhood Advisory Commission (MNAC) report. He prepared an annual report describing the duties and activities of MNAC. View the report.

The current MNAC Rep, Barbara Ryan, resigned and Bill agreed to become the new MNAC Rep. Barbara Zielstra volunteered to become the new MNAC Alternate and was elected by a majority vote.

- ENA Board Election: The following slate of board members were elected for a one-year term or until a new election is held at the next ENA Annual Meeting. We welcome new members, Kate Covell and Barbara Zielstra to the ENA Board.

That said: On a city-wide basis, without owner occupancy for short-term rentals, things getting out of hand at even a small minority of places can become an issue of significance for the city — certainly around noise and traffic, if not actual violence.




